Final Bill submission	7 <sup>th</sup> June, firm deadline.



#### **Expectations of Participants**

- Commit to attending all mentor and team meetings (we've cut them down to make this

- Attend the entirety of the camps including the full Training Weekend and Week of Youth Parliament

# Everything you need to know about writing your Bill...



#### Mentor Meetings

- Resource people will help you to coordinate and set meetings with a taskforce mentor
- 3 total meetings:
  - 1. Preliminary research and idea development
  - 2. Further research and clause brainstorming
  - 3. Adding structure and more detail ahead of PTW
- You will finish writing your Bills on PTW with support from the taskforce
- Feedback provided between meetings,
- You are expected to continue work in between meetings



#### Bill Writing tips

#### THE BILL IS HOW, THE DEBATE IS WHY

- The purpose of a Bill is to describe a process which will address an issue.
- State based topics only: includes education, hospitals, transport (roads, railways and PT), emergency services, environment, police and corrections.
- Our Bills are between **8-10 clauses long**, including 3 clauses which describe the issue and set context for the Bill.



#### **Topic Submission**

They must be submitted to Ryan by 11:59PM, March 10th Topics will be assigned by March 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### Some examples of previous Bill Topics:

- Increasing Public Safety in Rural and Regional Areas
- Reforming the Education System
- Decreasing Temperatures in Urban Areas.
